



DATA. NC In-depth training on “Evidence-based policy processes”

Working agenda.

Description: To help the shortlisted consortia develop quality interventions, international experts with support of DATA partners from, have designed In-depth training “Evidence-based policy processes”. The purpose of the training is to introduce the shortlisted NC members to a methodology of improving their strategies and action plans vis-à-vis their specific sectoral challenges. The NCs will carry an exercise: from identifying and formulating the issue/challenge to checking the evidence and the data supporting their findings to processing the subject matter with the help of think tanks/policy experts to policy recommendations, and, eventually, to communicating the core policy issue to various groups of stakeholders and beneficiaries.

Participants: Representatives of 5 shortlisted consortia networks - 20 CSOs. Based on the training results, five NCs will revise and submit the project concepts.
